SLEEPS THE LONG SLEEP

Death of the Aged Rev. Francis Dobbs, Portsmouth.

Rev Francis W. Dobbs, Portsmouth, the patriarchal clergyman of Ontario diocese, and rector of St. John's church for forty-seven years is at reset.

After an earthly career of eighty-seven years in the service of the Master, the angel of death closed his noble life, and summoned him to the mansions of the blest. On Tuesday at an early hour, the aged priest of the church passed away. For the past few years he has been gradually weakening, the years of his life hanging heavily upon him. On Monday the end was seen to be at hand, and those of kindred and beloved gathered home to stand around the bedside and watch the closing hours of a grandly spent life. The vigil was constant, and it was with tearful eye that at last they gazed upon the quiet form, in the endless sleep, with face like that of a saint greatly beloved.

The late Mr. Dobbs was born in Dublin, Ireland, on March 24, 1814, being the son of a queen's counsel, and was educated in divinity at Sat. Aiden's, England. It was through the influence of his sister, the mother of Sir Richard J. Cartwright, that he was persuaded to leave business life and enter the church. That would be fifty years ago next September, Mr. Dobbs having passed away just as he was about to complete his jubilee year in holy orders.

After holding several minor charges in England, he came to Canada, and in January 1854, was appointed to the charge of the parish of St. John's church, Portsmouth, where he had labored unceasingly ever since. Last Easter he resigned the rectorship, to which Rev. J.O. Crisp, formerly curate, was appointed.

St. John's church, during Mr. Dobbs incumbency, underwent great changes. When he took charge in 1854 it was more like a school-house. Now it is double the size, and a transit and a chancel were first added. Then, two years ago, the church was entirely remodeled, and three years abo the present school-house was built. The cost of the first mentioned change was largely met by Mr. Dobbs' friends in Ireland. A parsonage was also built for his personal; use by his friends, but before his death he conveyed all his interest in it and the ground, in trust to the synod, for his successor, subject to his occupancy during his lifetime.

Mr. Dobbs was a man of the greatest nobility of character and greatly revered by all who knew him. Not only was this so of Anglicans, but of all other denominations, for there was perhaps no other Church of England minister in Ontario who was so liberal minded. Mrs. Dobbs associated with the evangelical churches in all good work.

His wife, Miss Graham Lisburn, Ireland, died nineteen years ago. The family surviving consists of: Mrs. Robert O'Hara, Chatham; Rev. Conway Dobbs, Austin, Manitoba; Rev. O/G. Dobbs. Brockville; F. Dobbs and H.R.C. Dobbs, Kingston; and Miss Dobbs at home. All were present at the last, except his son in Manitoba.

Flags of the Portsmouth town hall, public school, and private residences are flying at half-mast out of respect to the memory of the dead clergyman.

Cartwright, Sir Richard John

Canadian statesman, b. in Kingston, 4 Dec., 1835. He was educated in his native city, and in Trinity college, Dublin, and entered parliament as a conservative in 1863, but in 1870 formally severed his connection with the conservative party. Sir Francis Hincks, minister of finance, brought forward a banking act, which Mr. Cartwright, who was president of the commercial bank in Canada and at the head of other important financial institutions, denounced as calculated to undermine the security of the Canadian banks. He voted against his old party on several questions, but was re-elected in 1872. He then identified himself thoroughly with the reform party, and in 1873 accepted office in Mr. Mackenzie's administration as minister of finance, and was sworn of the privy council. In 1878 he carried and important bill that makes the auditor-general removable only on an address by both houses of parliament, and not, as formerly at the pleasure of the government of the day. At the general election of 1878, when the country adopted the "national policy" (i.e, protection), Mr. Cartwright's free-trade principles brought about his defeat at the polls. A constituency was subsequently found for him in Centre Huron. On 24 May, 1879, he was knighted. Sir Richard is a leader of the liberal party, and a keen critic of the financial policy of his political opponents.

Sir Richard Cartwright Dies Following Operation

Succumbs In Hospital at Kingston, Ont., with Members of Family Gathered About his Bedside - Had Been Ill but Short Time - was Placed in Care of Physicians Last Thursday.

Kingston, Ont., Set 24 - Sir Richard Cartwright, who underwent an operation in the Kingston General Hospital last Thursday morning for strangulated hernia, took a bad turn during the night and died at 11:25 o'clock this morning. At 10 o'clock a consultation of doctors decided that his life was rapidly passing away, and they proved to be right. The venerable statesman dropped into unconsciousness prior to his death.

Heart failure was the immediate cause. Lady Cartwright and other members of the family were at his bedside during his last moments. His end was peaceful. The funeral will be private.

Sir Richards's History

Right Hon. Sir Richard John Cartwright, P.C., G.C.M.G., created 1897; K.C.M.G., created 1879; senator, exminister of trade and commerce and leader of the senate of Canada, was born at Kingston, Ont., December 14, 1835, the son of R.D. Cartwright, chaplain of the Forces, Kingston, Ont., and Harriet, daughter of Conway Edward Dobbs, of Dublin, Ireland; grandson of Hon. Richard Cartwright, formerly a judge of common pleas in Upper Canada, and afterwards a member of the legislative council of that province.

In 1859 he married Frances, daughter of Colonel Alexander Lawe, of Cork, Ireland, from which union he had six sons and three daughters. He was educated at Trinity College, Dublin; became president of the Commercial Bank of Canada; was president, director, or trustee of several commercial and financial corporations; during its existence was president of the Reform Club. Toronto; was president of the eastern Ontar4io Liberal Association formed in 1897.

Started Conservative

He was elected to the parliament for Old Canada as a Conservative, representing Lennox and Addington, in 1863. And continued to sit for that constituency until 1867, shortly after confederation, when he quarreled with his party on the question of its financial policy, which he considered extravagant.

Bu 1870 the breach was complete, and in 1873 he became finance minister of the Liberal ministry of Hon. Alexander Mackenzie.

His honesty and economy were undoubted, but the latter quality was sometimes pushed to extremes. From 1878 to 1896, he was the chief financial critic on the side of the Liberal opposition, and on the accession of Sir Wilfrid Laurier to power in 1896, became minister of trade and commerce.

In 1898 and 1899 he represented Canada on the Anglo-American joint high commission at Quebec. In 1904 failing health let to his retirement to the senate. He acted in Sir Wilfrid Laurier's absence at the imperial conference in 1907 as acing premier.

Archdeacon Dobbs Died on Saturday

Greatly Esteemed Anglican Churchman - His Passing is Loss to Church

The Venerable Ogilvie Graham Dobbs, M.A., D.D., Archdeacon of Kingston, passed away in the General Hospital shortly after three o'clock on Saturday afternoon, January 14, following a severe illness of a little more than a week.

Archdeacon Dobbs was stricken with angina pectoris and removed to the hospital; some eight or nine days ago. While his condition was admitted to be critical, he was feeling somewhat better, and more free of pain on Saturday, death appearing very remote. On Saturday afternoon he was visited by his brother J.R.C. Dobbs, with whom he chatted. Mr. Dobbs having no idea that death was imminent and being greatly shocked to receive the news of the Archdeacon's passing only ten or fifteen minutes after leafing his bedside.

Born in England

Archdeacon Dobbs, who would have been seventy-five years of age in February, was the son of the late Rev. and Mrs. F.W. Dobbs, his father being at one time rector of St. John's church, Portsmouth. The Archdeacon was the last member of the family to be born in England prior to his father coming to Canada, his birthplace being Wakefield.

He graduated from the University of Toronto and Wycliffe College in 1874, and during the present year his Alma Mater honored him with laureation in the honorary degree of Doctor of Divinity during the anniversary gathering in Toronto in which the Archdeacon took the very greatest interest.

Ordained by Holy Orders by the Bishop of Toronto the Archdeacon's first charge was the incumbency of Wyebridge, Wyevale and Allandale, Ont., afterwards going to St. John, N.B., as curate in "The Stone Church"" under the Rev. George M. Armstrong from where he was appointed rector of Carleton, N.B.

On coming to the Diocese of Ontario he was appointed rector of St. Paul's Church, Brockville, in 18980, becoming Rural Dean of Leeds and holding this important charge for many years.

He was appointed Archdeacon of Kingston in 1913 by the late Rt. Rev. Bishop Mills, accepting the chaplaincy at the Portsmouth Penitentiary in 1914 and retiring from the latter appointment early in 1926.

Assisted the Bishop

As Archdeacon of Kingston, with ecclesiastical rank only junior to the Dean of Ontario, Archdeacon Dobbs was for the last few years acknowledged to be the Bishop's "right hand man." Having no parish his duties were many and varied, both Bishop Bidwell and the present Bishop, Rt. Rev. Dr. C.A. Seager, finding him invaluable in the willing and able assistance he rendered in the administration of the Dioceses.

During the absence of Bishop Bidwell from the Diocese, and during the time that the Diocese of Ontario was without a Bishop, Archdeacon Dobbs acted as Bishop's Commissary and administered the affairs of the Diocese with success.

As a member of the Diocesan Synod of Ontario his opinion was always accepted on matters pertaining to administration, while as a member of the General Synod of the Church of England in Canada his advice on matters of Dominion-wide interest was eagerly sought by the younger clergy.

As the chairman of the Diocesan Mission Board, Archdeacon Dobbs had the mission work of the Diocese under his jurisdiction, and it is to the active interest which he displayed in the diocesan missions and to his executive ability and administrative efficiency that the progress made in the outlying stations in the diocese is due.

Man of Fine Qualities

A man of never failing courtesy, kindness, tack and thoughtfulness for other, the Archdeacon had a multitude of friends outside the Church which he loved and served so well for the greater p[art of his active and useful life. A broad-minded Churchman he was often to be found listening to the leaders of other communions in the church Universal and numbered many friends among the ministers of other denominations both Catholic and Protestant.

His whole life was wrapped up in the work which he had undertaken for his Master, and few other interest entered into his thoughts, although he was a lover of nature and for many years a successful exhibiting member of the Kingston Horticultural Society, while he took a deep and sympathetic interest in the work of the Kingston Humane Society administered by his brother.

Known all over the city for his kindliness and readiness to lend a helping hand to the unfortunate, there are hundreds of Kingstonians who will regret his passing, while to the members of the different Anglican congregations in the city his death comes as a great loss.

He is survived by three brothers; Rev C.E. Dobbs of Winnipeg, Man.; Frank W. Dobbs and John R.C. Dobbs, both of this city.

The remains of the late Archbishop were placed in the chancel of the Cathedral on Monday afternoon in order that those who knew him may pass in reverent love and respect before his earthly remains which will remain in the Cathedral until Tuesday morning, while the funeral service will be held in the Cathedral at 2:20 p.m. on Tuesday.

Lieut. C. Dobbs Loses His Life in Accident

Lieut. Conway Edward Dobbs, grandson of the late Rev. F.W. Dobbs, who was rector of St. John's Church, Portsmouth, for 47 years, was killed in a freak accident at Parry Sound on Oct 12.

Lieut. Dobbs, who received his discharge from the Canadian Army about three months ago, and an executive of a Toronto lumber firm with which he was associated, were inspecting timber contracts in Parry Sound district. Lack of accommodation forced them to spend the night outdoors in sleeping bags and during the night, a huge boulder dislodged from a nearby hillside. fell on Lieut. Dobbs as he slept. His companion was unharmed, but found it impossible to remove the rock from the legs and body of the lieutenant, who died two hours later.

Born at Valcartier, Que., he was the only son of the late Capt. The Rev. C.E. Dobbs and Mrs. Dobbs of Winnipeg. An uncle, Ven. Archdeacon O.G. Dobbs was chaplain at Kingston Penitentiary for many years. He was the scion of an old Irish family, being a great-grandson of the late Chancellor Dobbs of Dublin.

Deceased was educated at Ridley College, St. Catharines and St. John's College, Winnipeg. He enlisted in a remount battalion early in the First World War, later transferring to the Royal Canadian Dragoons and served almost four years overseas.

He suffered a serious leg wound in action and won his commission on the field with the 6th reserve.

In the Second World War, lieut. Dobbs served overseas for five and one-half years. He joined the Ordnance Corps in Toronto and went overseas in January, 1940, and received severe chest injuries when crushed by a tank.

Returning to Canada in May of this year, he visited his sister, Mrs. W.G. Overholt of Winnipeg while on disembarkation leave. For several years he was a sales manager for hosiery firms in Ontario and Alberta and had recently resided at 31 Donegal Drive, Toronto.

He is survived by his wife, the former Isobel Jane Collingwood of Northumberland, England; one son, Conway Graham Dobbs, 18, and one daughter, Elaine Virginia Dobbs, 14; also one sister, Mrs. W.G. Overholt of Winnipeg.

Funeral was held on Thursday, Oct 18, when full military honors were accorded to the late soldier.

Defended Cartwright Point, lawyer, naturalist dies at 84

Kingston lawyer and naturalist Henry Lennox Cartwright, 84, died at his home on Cartwright Point last Saturday. His widow, the former Moira Law, said this morning that her husband has said the heavily wooded 60-acre point south of Canadian Forces Base Kingston should be his memorial because he had so long defended it against appropriation by the Department of National Defence.

Born in Toronto in 1905, he began his legal practice here in 1929, retiring in 1984 because of failing eyesight, she said. A descendant of United Empire Loyalists, Mr, Cartwright had been an unsuccessful candidate for the Canadian Commonwealth Federation party on several occasions and wrote poetry and plays in addition to legal articles.

He was a keen naturalist, wilderness paddler and curler, Mrs. Cartwright said. He was also chairman of the old Kingston Board of Education for two terms and served on a number of city committees.

He was predeceased by his first wife, the late Ver Robinson, and his brothers Richard and William. In addition to his wife of 29 years, Mr. Cartwright is survived by his daughter Katherine of Kingston, his son John of London and his stepdaughter Sheila Hart of Revelstoke.
